Step 2: Style

Style is the next significant variable in the design process. There are many styles to chose from, but most owners typically have a favorite that they want their house built in. One of the best ways to communicate to us the look you want is to use pictures. They are worth a thousand words and really help to communicate your preferences. Web sites like Houzz and Pinterest are great research tools for owners and images can be shared with us directly from the sites.

Step 1: Size

We start with general size of the home.

Typically we compare to the home you live in to get a feel for space; do you want larger or smaller?

For rough numbers on construction, multiply the square footage by \$200 for a cost effective home, and up to \$400 for highend construction.



Step 3: Budget

A vital step is to determine how much money you have to spend on your project. Most clients have an upper limit on what they are willing to spend, and it wise to design to only 85% to 90% of this cost. This will allow room in the budget later for any last minute upgrades, or to allow a cushion for unforeseen construction costs.



Questionnaire:

The rest of the questionnaire begins a room by room analysis of the requirements for your new home. We begin with the entry to your home, the front porch.
